President's Report

Executive Meetings (1-Day: October, April; 2-Day: September, January)

I can't tell you how hard the Executive has worked this year on behalf of teacher-librarians. From Drop Everything and Read planning to communicating with BCTLA members to writing articles and grant proposals, your 2008-09 Executive deserves every accolade. I salute Sylvia Zubke, Karen Lindsay, Bonnie McComb, Halia Hirniak, Al Smith, Lauren Craze, Amanda Hufton, Lynn Turner, Angie MacRitchie, Bonnie McComb, Moira Ekdahl, and Val Hamilton, all volunteers who gave thousands of hours of their own time this year, including engaging in four in-person meetings totalling five full days, to their love of school libraries and their belief in the work of B.C.'s teacher-librarians!

Modernizing BCTLA Governance and Operations (Throughout Year)

A major focus of the year, and in the years to come, will be the modernization of BCTLA's governance and operations. Changes that have already taken place have included *The Bookmark* becoming an online, open access journal that is being used as a model by other associations. The BCTLA Constitution and Bylaws were revised in 2008-09 and a draft document was produced for consideration. For the first time in years, new awards have been instituted, including a Lifetime Achievement award and possibly an award for New Teacher-Librarian of the Year. A process for BCTLA Chapters being able to access BCTLA resources for projects and professional development has been drafted. The BCTLA's first position statement, on book leveling, has been written with the hope of more to come. Planning for provincial professional development will be taking place through the addition of a second appointed Continuing Education Chair for 2009-10. BCTLA has joined with other provincial and territorial school library associations in beginning dialogue about a national advocacy strategy. We have also, for the first time, begun to consider funding teacher-librarian speakers and representatives to attend school library conferences, including the CLA/CASL Conference and the IASL Conference. BCTLA also continues to work on the first provincial Information Literacy framework.

Communication (Throughout Year)

The BCTLA is known internationally for our incredibly strong web presence. The "BCTLA - In Circulation" blog, available at <http://bctlaincirculation.blogspot.com/>, is just one of our communication venues. "In Circulation" acts a newsletter about what is happening at BCTLA. The BCTLA Forum has been active this year, as has the Executive email list (to the tune of ~2000 messages). The BCTLA received press coverage this year due to the Drop Everything and Read campaign and National School Library Day. In addition, numerous letters were written to government, the Lieutenant Governor, and Auditor General. Several articles were prepared for the BCTF's *Teacher Newsmagazine*, including one for the special election issue.

PSAC (Provincial Specialist Association Council) and the BCTF (Throughout Year)

PSAC (Provincial Specialist Association Council) is composed of each of the presidents of the BCTF's 33 PSAs. The council comes together for two full-day meetings three times a year. Major issues at PSAC, common to all PSAs, included problems with PSA membership lists and renewals. As a result, PSA membership work has been assigned to an alternate department at BCTF and new structures have been developed. PSAC has also been involved in the PSA Task Force, which included a survey of PSA members and a report with recommendations.

October: BCTLA Conference, NSLD and Drop Everything and Read (DEAR)

This year's Canadian Library Month (October 2008) was just amazing. Canadian Library Month posters and bookmarks were sent to all public school districts from BCTLA for distribution to school libraries. We also had a fabulous BCTLA conference in Victoria! Thank you to the Greater Victoria Teacher-Librarians' Association for all of their work. Immediately following the Conference, we celebrated National School Library Day and the Drop Everything and Read (DEAR) challenge. The DEAR challenge was an incredible success. Thank you to everyone who participated and to the Executive for all of their work in planning for the day. In particular, I would like to thank Karen Lindsay and Bonnie Chapman for their inspiring initiative.

Liaison with Libraries, Associations, Organizations, and Ministry (Throughout Year)

A continuing focus for BCTLA has been liaison in particular with public, academic, and special libraries and other provincial library associations. BCTLA has continued to be represented on the Library 2020 Interim Steering Committee. This year, the Library 2020 project produced consultation reports and BCTLA sponsored two school library consultation sessions and submitted detailed feedback. We were also involved in planning and executing the "West Beyond the West: B.C. Digitization Symposium" in December, and with the support of the BCTF we were able to bring twenty educators to the event. BCTLA is also pleased to be a part of this year's inaugural BC Library Conference, through the integration of our annual Spring Council and AGM into the conference. Chapter Councilors will attend BCTLA meetings in the morning and the Conference in the afternoon. With BCLA and BCLTA (the BC Library Trustees' Association), we were involved in the development of WebJunction BC, an online professional and staff development portal for B.C. library staff. BCTLA members will be able to create profiles and take online continuing education courses through WebJunction BC. BCTLA has also been involved in discussions with ERAC throughout the year in a consultative role on the multisector database implementation. In particular, BCTLA has offered suggestions on the toolkits and training which will be launched in late April 2009 through 2010.

Awards and Grants (Spring 2009)

We were thrilled in early Spring 2009 to be announced as one of three PSAs to receive a \$7500 grant for a Program for Quality Teaching teacher inquiry group through the BCTF. Nine teacher-librarians are currently engaging in professional learning around evidence-based practice in B.C. school libraries. We are also excited to be awarding all of the BCTLA awards this year and have news of a number of national awards to be announced for B.C. teacher-librarians.

Ongoing Challenges: Memberships and Conference Attendance

Although 2008-09 has been a year of hard work and great successes, we continue to have some challenges as an association. Our conference numbers are still lower than we would like and our membership has fluctuated—from 395 to 505 to 354 throughout the year. It is my hope that the efforts of the BCTLA Executive, Chapter Councilors, and the BCTLA membership will result, over time, in increased and sustained membership and conference attendance.

February

Working and Learning Conditions Chair's Report

The survey was once again launched with National and International School Library Day on October 20, 2009. The questions on the survey stayed the same with the exception of the question re the formula for identifying the "flexible" scheduled library time. This question has been problematic over the years as we have tried to get closer to a comparable number between all districts. At the suggestion of the BCTF researchers, the question was simplified into two questions, whereby the teacher-librarian could first identify how much FTE time is allotted to the library and then, out of that amount of time, identify how much of the time is flexibly scheduled teacher-librarian time.

This year there were 100 fewer surveys received than last year. We are looking into the reasons for this, wondering if it is due to further school closures and declining membership. If there are any suggestions by Chapter Councilors as to why the response rate isn't 100%, please e-mail me at kaela2@shaw.ca.

This year, there will be one paper publication that will show the data for the 2008-09 year, as well as a comparison to earlier years. The qualitative data will continue to be analyzed. As the BCTF is involved in other projects, the estimated time for the publication is in May 2009.

The conference had the theme, "Mission: Literacy—Teachers and Teacher-Librarians: Not-So-Secret Agents of Change". The conference was preceded by a successful Author's Festival and marked the beginning of BCTLA Chapters utilizing online conference registration systems. While the conference was wonderful, with incredible speakers, food, and vendor displays, there were again not as many conference delegates as there have been in previous years.

Throughout Spring 2009, Sylvia Zubke worked with the BC Library Association to ensure the integration of the BCTLA Spring Council and AGM as part of the annual BC Library Conference. It is hoped that the involvement of a large number of teacher-librarians in the BC Library Conference will be of benefit to all BC Library Conference delegates.

The Richmond Teacher-Librarians' Association will host the 2009 BCTLA Conference at Richmond Secondary School. The theme will be "Champions of Literacy" and will feature former National Librarian of Canada and author Roch Carrier as the keynote. Of particular interest is the Thursday night wine and cheese being planned at the Richmond Olympic Oval. Come for the tour of the Olympic speedskating venue and meet the 2010 Winter Olympics mascots! Incredible and inspiring learning will take place on the Friday. We hope all teacher-librarians will join us on October 22-23 in Richmond.

Continuing Education Chair's Report

The main focus for Continuing Education this year has been the development of a K-12 framework of skills for information literacy. Last Spring, a group of about 6-8 teacher-librarians met to launch the project and to decide on a direction from which to approach the subject. When the call went out in September for the first working committee meeting, however, only three people were able to attend. Moira Ekdahl, Julie Robinson, and Michele Farquharson, in addition to the CE chair, began the task of deciding what would be included in a K-12 skills framework; what the finished product would look like; what the timelines should be; and what categories would be covered by each person.

Although some of the first ideas have been modified, and timelines have been lengthened, the goal has remained the same: to produce a document focused on information literacy with benchmarks of skills at Grade 3, 7, 10, and 12. These benchmarks have been selected from B.C. IRPs as well as from "scope and sequences" from other jurisdictions, both national and international. There will also be a section bridging to the skills required for successful research at college and university libraries.

This spring, the committee hopes to put a very initial draft of the document onto the BCTLA website for examination and feedback from teacher-librarians. A professional writer will be hired to work with the committee for the final draft, which will be both in web and hard copy formats. An executive summary will also be produced. It is hoped that this document will be endorsed by a variety of groups, including teacher-librarians, academic and public librarians, school districts, and perhaps the Ministry of Education. Initial outlines of the document—entitled "Reading, Resources, and Research: The New 3 Rs in Education"—will be presented by the committee at the BC Library Conference in April 2009.

As CE chair, I would like to take this opportunity to thank Moira, Julie, and Michele for their extraordinary efforts and dedication to making this project a success, and to the BCTLA Executive for their support.

Early on in the position of CE chair, I undertook to encourage those post-secondary institutes with teacher training programmes to include teacher-librarians at some point in the preparation of pre-service teachers. Suggestions covered the spectrum from a very short presentation ("What Your Teacher-Librarian Can Do For You") to a collaboratively planned-and-taught unit during a practicum. It seems now that many student teacher programs are requesting such involvement. Furthermore, teacher-librarians are seeking out the student teachers in their schools, and are working with them. The BCTLA also has a presence at the New Teachers' Conference.

A couple of years ago, a list of workshop presenters was put together with input from teacher-librarians around the province. It is now time to update that list, both for presenters and for possible workshop topics.
