SD #27 (Cariboo-Chilcotin)	\$2,000	Masculinity/Beauty Forum Workshops for all Grade 7 students in the district to challenge gender-role stereotyping, body image pressures, and stereotypical images of power and strength.
SD #41 (Burnaby)	\$1,000	Community Art Project Creation of a cultural diversity mural and cultural workshops for students.
SD #85 (Vancouver Island North)	\$1,500	Unite Sunset School K to 7 Multicultural Week celebration integrating literacy and fine arts curriculum.
SD #57 (Prince George)	\$1,600	Parent-Child Mother Goose Parent-child early family literacy program for pre-school children and caregivers.
SD #43 (Coquitlam)	\$1,000	Advancing Social Responsibility–Promoting Peace Artist-in-residence program which integrates poetry and art in nine classrooms.
SD #78 (Fraser-Cascade)	\$2,000	One World, Our World Global funfair with activities and games to learn about daily life and basic needs of children in other countries. Involved K to 12 students across the district including Peace 10-12, Social Justice 12, and Leadership students.
SD #41 (Burnaby)	\$2,000	“Belonging”–Raising Student Leadership Capacity School-wide focus on skill-building for socially responsible behaviour. Integrated many subject areas and involved school staff, students, teachers, and district staff.
SD #83 (North Okanagan-Shuswap)	\$1,500	Making A Difference Novel studies on human rights and global education. Leadership seminar by youth activist and motivational speaker.
SD #39 (Vancouver)	\$1,500	Expressions Graffiti art and hip-hop dance program where students create music to promote social justice. Program focuses on racism, sexism, and homophobia.
SD #8 (Kootenay Lake)	\$2,000	Ivan Coyote Author and storyteller on homophobia and transphobia presented in school-wide assemblies in four high schools. Follow-up workshops done with students on these topics.

SD #8 (Kootenay Lake)	\$1,500	Youth Developing Right Relationships: Through the Teachings of the Medicine Wheel Work with Aboriginal elders and community experts to teach Grade 9 students medicine wheel elements and how they relate to self-expression (8-week program).
SD #79 (Cowichan Valley)	\$1,250	Building Community Capacity to Support “At Risk” Students Teacher-training program (release time) for supporting at-risk students. Developing workshops for district on strategic interventions to support these students.
SD #70 (Port Alberni)	\$1,000	Cedar Weaving and Art Project Cedar weaving and art project in preparation for a potlatch ceremony.
SD #39 (Vancouver)	\$2,000	Windermere Youth Sustainability Network Grade 11 students educate and mentor elementary students about environmental justice. This involves interactive workshops with youth-driven community organizations.
