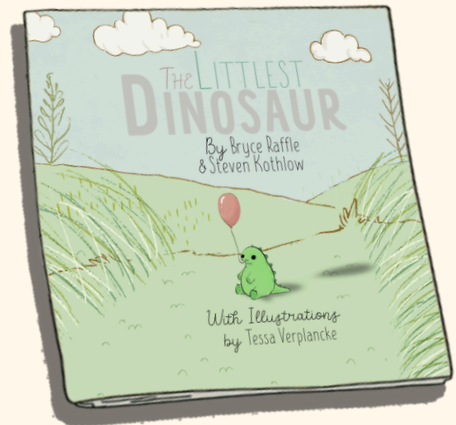
Lesson Inspired by: The Littlest Dinosaur Written by: Bryce Raffle & Steven Kothlow, Illustrated by: Tessa Verplancke

Topic: Literature, Arts & Crafts,
Dinosaurs

Grade: K-2

Objectives:

Students will listen to The Littlest Dinosaur, discuss the story and characters. Students create a dinosaur egg craft inspired by the story, developing fine motor skills through cutting, colouring, and gluing.



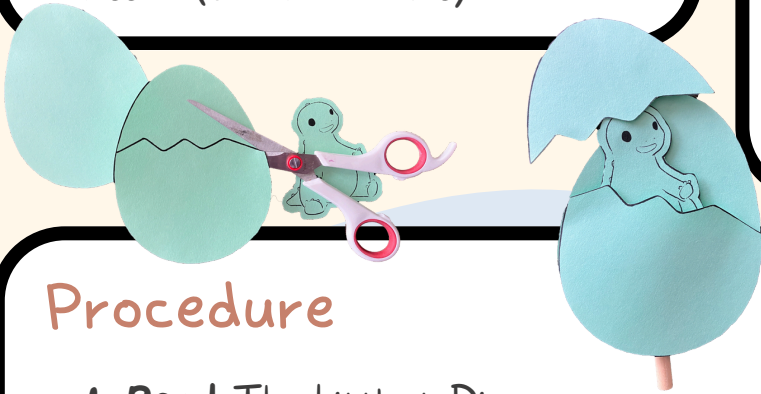
Time:

1 lesson (30-45 minutes)



Materials:

- The Littlest Dinosaur (book)
- Pop-Up Egg Craft template
- Scissors, glue, coloured pencils
- Popsicle sticks



Procedure

1. **Read** The Littlest Dinosaur.
2. **Discuss** the story. What did the students like about it? What was the problem Ty the Tyrannosaurus needed to solve? What can we learn from the story?
3. **Craft:** Hand out the craft template sheet to each student. Have them colour their dinosaur and egg. Students carefully cut along the lines (assist as needed). Students assemble the dinosaur according to the instructions on the website:
